

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

1. PURPOSE OF THE MEMORANDUM

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to establish a framework for cooperation between the University and Medestan in the following areas:

- a. Facilitation of medical tourism from the Kyrgyz Republic to India, including referral of patients from the University and the Kyrgyz Republic for advanced treatment at facilities associated with Medestan.

- b. Exchange of medical doctors and specialists between the University's affiliated hospitals and Medestan's network for short-term visits, training, and collaborative clinical practice.
- c. Exchange of medical technology, innovative ideas, best practices, and knowledge in healthcare delivery and medical education.
- d. Joint organization and participation in seminars, conferences, workshops, and continuing medical education programs.
- e. Provision of observership opportunities for medical students of the University at Medestan-associated hospitals and facilities in India.

2. DURATION OF THE MEMORANDUM

This MoU shall commence on the date of signing by both parties and remain in force for a period of three (2) years, until January, 2028, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions herein. The MoU may be renewed for additional periods upon mutual written agreement of both parties.

3. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

3.1 The University

- a. Identify and refer patients from the Kyrgyz Republic requiring specialized treatment unavailable or less accessible locally to Medestan.
- b. Nominate qualified doctors and faculty members for exchange visits to Medestan facilities.
- c. Select and nominate suitable medical students for observership programs.
- d. Organize and cohost seminars, conferences, and academic events in the Kyrgyz Republic or online.
- e. Share relevant medical technologies, research findings, and educational resources where permissible.
- f. Ensure that all participating doctors and students meet necessary academic, professional, and health requirements, including valid visas and insurance coverage.

3.2 Medestan

- a. Provide priority access and coordinated medical services for patients referred by the University, including treatment planning, cost estimates, and logistical support.

- b. Host doctors from the University for exchange visits and provide clinical exposure and training opportunities.
- c. Provide observership placements for university medical students in its associated hospitals, including supervision by qualified staff.
- d. Organize and cohost seminars, conferences, and academic events in India or online.
- e. Share medical technologies, clinical protocols, and innovative practices with the University.
- f. Assist with visa invitations and logistical arrangements for visiting doctors and students where required.

4. COLLABORATION DETAILS

4.1 Medical Tourism

- The University will serve as a referral point for patients seeking treatment in India.
- Medestan will provide transparent information on treatment options, costs, and outcomes, and ensure high-quality care for referred patients.

4.2 Doctor Exchange

- Exchanges may last from 2 weeks to 3 months, as mutually agreed.
- Each party may host up to 10 doctors per year, subject to adjustment by mutual agreement.

4.3 Observership for Students

- The University may nominate up to 20 medical students per year for observership programs of 2–4 weeks duration.
- Students will observe clinical practice under supervision but will not perform independent procedures.

4.4 Seminars, Conferences, and Knowledge Exchange

- Both parties will collaborate on at least one joint event per year (seminar, conference, or workshop), either in person or virtual.
- Topics may include advancements in medical technology, clinical best practices, medical education, and healthcare management.

5. SUPERVISION AND EVALUATION

- Visiting doctors and students will be assigned qualified supervisors by the host institution.
- The host institution will provide feedback on performance and participation to the sending institution at the conclusion of each visit or program.

6. FACILITIES AND RESOURCES

Each party will provide necessary access to facilities, equipment, and educational resources required for the agreed activities, while maintaining patient safety and confidentiality.

7. INSURANCE AND LIABILITY

- The sending party shall ensure that its doctors and students are covered by appropriate health and professional liability insurance for the duration of activities under this MoU.
- Each party agrees to indemnify and hold the other harmless against claims arising from the negligent acts or omissions of its own personnel.

8. CONFIDENTIALITY

Both parties and their participating personnel shall maintain strict confidentiality regarding patient information, proprietary technologies, and any sensitive data shared during collaboration, in accordance with applicable laws.

9. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

- This MoU is based on mutual benefit and no fixed financial compensation is envisaged between the parties.
- Each party will bear its own costs for organizing events, travel, accommodation, and daily expenses of its personnel, unless otherwise agreed in writing for specific activities.
- Patient treatment costs under medical tourism will be borne by the patients or their insurers as per Medestan's standard pricing.

10. TERMINATION

- This MoU may be terminated by mutual consent or by either party with ninety (90) days' written notice.
- Termination shall not affect ongoing patient treatment or committed programs unless otherwise agreed.

11. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Any disputes arising from this MoU shall first be addressed through amicable negotiation. If unresolved, the parties agree to refer the matter to mediation before pursuing legal remedies.

12. MISCELLANEOUS


- This MoU is not legally binding except for clauses relating to confidentiality and liability.
- Amendments must be in writing and signed by both parties.
- This document constitutes the entire understanding between the parties.


