

POLICY
on the Quality of Education
of Jalal-Abad International University (JAIU)

1. General Provisions

1.1. This Policy on the Quality of Education at Jalal-Abad International University (hereinafter referred to as the Policy, the University, or JAIU) defines the University's strategic guidelines, principles, and objectives in the areas of educational quality, research, clinical practice, and other activities.

1.2. The Policy has been developed in accordance with the mission and vision of JAIU, the University's Charter, the legislation of the Kyrgyz Republic on education, State educational standards, the requirements of national and international accreditation agencies, as well as the principles of international quality standards (ISO 9001:2015, ESG/ENQA, WFME).

1.3. This policy serves as the foundation for the operation of JAIU's education quality management system and is implemented through the Regulations on the Quality Management System and related local regulations.

2. Mission and Vision

2.1. The mission of JAIU is formulated as follows:

"To prepare a new generation of professionals through the integration of cutting-edge educational technologies and scientific research, capable of addressing global challenges of sustainable social development and ready for healthy competition in the labor market."

2.2. Vision of JAIU: The University strives to be an internationally recognized educational and scientific center providing high-quality higher education for students from Kyrgyzstan and from neighboring and distant foreign countries.

3. Strategic Guidelines for Quality

JAIU implements its Quality Policy through the following strategic priorities:

3.1. International Competitiveness

The University's educational programs are developed and implemented in accordance with national and international standards, ensuring the recognition of diplomas, the academic and professional mobility of graduates, and the attractiveness of JAIU to international students.

3.2. Student-centered and competency-based approach

Education is focused on developing students' professional competencies, clinical reasoning, critical analysis skills, research and digital competencies, as well as their ability for self-directed learning and teamwork.

3.3. Integration of Education, Research, and Practice

The university ensures a close connection between the educational process and scientific research, clinical and professional practice, and implements evidence-based approaches in teaching and management.

3.4. Digital Transformation and Innovation

JAIU consistently implements digital educational technologies, LMS and e-services, simulation and virtual platforms, elements of artificial intelligence, and hybrid and online learning formats, ensuring the accessibility and flexibility of the educational process.

3.5. Sustainable Development and Social Responsibility

The University takes into account the goals of sustainable human development, contributes to improving public health and the development of regions in Kyrgyzstan, neighboring countries, and countries further abroad, and promotes a culture of academic integrity, tolerance, and respect for cultural diversity.

3.6. Continuous Quality Improvement

JAIU systematically collects and analyzes data on learning outcomes, student, graduate, and employer satisfaction, and the results of internal and external evaluations, and implements corrective and preventive actions.

4. Principles for Implementing the Quality Policy

- 4.1. Stakeholder-oriented approach (students, faculty, employers, clinical partners, government agencies, society).
- 4.2. Leadership and personal responsibility of the University administration for quality and sustainable development.
- 4.3. Involvement of all staff in a culture of quality and academic integrity.
- 4.4. A process- and risk-oriented approach based on the PDCA (Plan–Do–Check–Act) cycle.
- 4.5. Transparency and openness regarding information on the quality of education and the University's performance results.
- 4.6. Partnerships and international cooperation with universities, research centers, clinics, and business entities.

5. Quality Objectives

- 5.1. The University sets measurable quality objectives in the following areas (exemplary list):
 - compliance of educational programs with state requirements and the standards of accreditation agencies;
 - increasing the proportion of faculty members with advanced degrees and international experience;
 - development of English-language educational programs and academic mobility;
 - increasing student satisfaction with the quality of instruction and infrastructure;
 - increasing student and faculty participation in research and publication activities;
 - Improving the digital educational environment and services for students and faculty.

5.2. Quality objectives are refined annually, broken down to the level of faculties, departments, and educational programs, and incorporated into the relevant work plans.

6. Responsibility for Implementing the Policy

6.1. Responsibility for the implementation of the Policy lies with the Rector of JAIU and the University administration.

6.2. Coordination of quality-related work is carried out by the Quality Council and relevant structural units (the Academic and Information Department, the Quality Department, deans' offices, departments, etc.).

6.3. All University staff and students are required to comply with the provisions of this Policy and local regulations pertaining to the quality of education and academic integrity.

7. Revision of the Policy

7.1. This Policy is subject to revision in the event of significant changes in external requirements or the University's strategic priorities, but no less frequently than once every 3–5 years.

7.2. Changes to the Policy are made by decision of the Rector, taking into account the proposals of the Quality Council and the Academic Council of JAIU.

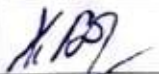
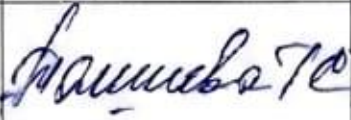
